III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

December 10, 2020 – *Tabled due to lack of quorum.*

IV. INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBERS

Gattie-Blanco shared Itzi Robles, Fresno EOC Commissioner, has been appointed to Sanctuary Advisory Board and works with City Councilmember Soria (former Commissioner and Sanctuary Advisory Board member).

V. PRESENTATION: Project HOPE

Natalie Chavez, guest from Fresno City College, presented a Power Point and highlighted Housing Opportunities Promote Education (HOPE), a new Fresno City College project in partnership with Fresno EOC. The three (3) program objectives include: 1) Providing funding and housing navigation to prevent homelessness, 2) Providing substance abuse treatment, if needed; and 3) Coordinating academic resources to increase persistence. Chavez shared Fresno City College is a test site, the first in the country to receive \$2 million federal award.

Arambula requested a copy of the presentation and shared her excitement with the new partnership between West Care, Fresno EOC and Fresno City College.

Tutunjian inquired about the steps on addressing homelessness in Fresno related to the “Entry Point” slide. Chavez responded and explained program entry is either through GED or

through substance abuse to clarify. Chavez shared there are people who never considered college who are actively participating in college just for the program and its services.

VI. PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENTS

Gattie-Blanco announced National Safe Place Week (March 21 – 27) activities would be posted on Sanctuary's social media pages.

Tutunjian asked Gattie-Blanco to share with the Committee the success of the CVAHT Virtual Conference. Gattie-Blanco stated nearly 200 people attended and overall evaluations were positive, attendees were pleased with the content and presenters. With the conference being virtual, it attracted attendance beyond the central valley; several individuals from San Diego, Santa Barbara and Sacramento attended. Many attendees have inquired about volunteer opportunities.

VII. PROGRAM UPDATES

- Program Activity Reports
Gattie-Blanco inquired if there were any questions.

Reyna inquired how MAP program was operating since LGBTQ Center is closed. Gattie-Blanco shared some staff are working from home and office. The program has been added to a phone tree, and staff are taking referrals from other Fresno EOC programs, and advertising through social media. The contract expires in June 2021.

- Accomplishments and Challenges
Gattie-Blanco shared program accomplishments and challenges as presented in handout.
- Program Funding Activities
Gattie-Blanco shared that CVAHT was awarded funding from CalOES, but is currently waiting for official award letter. The LGBTQ+ Resource Center was recently awarded over \$600,000 from Youth Opioid Response (YOR) to expand substance abuse and early intervention among the LGBTQ population and youth.

Gattie-Blanco shared the Transitional Shelter funding ends next year, as part of CalOES five-year Homeless Youth Pilot Program, but California Coalition for Youth is working with organizations and through a Legislative Advocate to ask the Senate and Assembly for funding to extend current projects and providers.
