III. Supplement to the Annual Update 2021-22 Local Control Accountability Plan

Due to the additional funding provided to the Local Education Agencies for COVID-19 recovery, this is the first and only time there will be a mid-year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) update. This update will delineate Mid-year metrics, expenditures and implementation data on all actions identified in the 2021-22 LCAP. Through a PowerPoint presentation, Lopez described each of the five prompts, how and when SOUL engaged its educational partners on the use of one-time federal funds received that are intended to support recovery from COVID-19 and the student impact. The five prompts are: 1. Educational Partner Engagement for Budget Act Funds, 2. Use of additional Concentration funding, 3. Educational Partner Engagement for One-Time Federal Funds, 4. Implementation of the ESSER III Expenditure Plan, and 5. Using fiscal resources consistent with LCAP.

Lopez presented the Impact to the Budget Overview for Parents. LCAP goals and actions were discussed, including: 1. improve student academic performance and College and Career Readiness by increasing Reading and Math levels of all SOUL students, 2. create greater student access to post-secondary opportunities by increasing school graduation rates, 3. increase student connectedness and expansion of career education, and 4. increase services to parents.

The plan was presented to SOUL's Governing Council which consists of parents, community members, staff and student representatives.

In the 2021-22 school year, the percentage of students who scored grade-level or higher in both Math and Language Arts increased across all grade-levels from fall to winter. At this time last year, during the 2020/2021 school year, the only growth between fall/winter in Math was among the 10th graders who increased by 3%. Comparatively, the only growth between fall/winter in Language last school year was among the 10th and 11th grade who increased by 11% and 3% respectively. The number of students scoring at grade-level is showing significant improvement so far this school year.

Overall, there has been a notable increase in the Math and Language Arts skills of students enrolled at SOUL. The individual instruction students receive in core subjects more adequately address skill deficiencies. A greater focus will be placed on the 11th grade students in the area of Language Arts as we prepare for the CAASPP tests in April, as well as an emphasis on students in the 12th grade in all subjects as they begin to prepare for college.

Students meeting projected growth are measured by a target score set by NWEA for each individual student based on their first test of the school year. Not only did a significant percentage of students meet their targeted growth between the fall and winter administrations, a higher percentage of students than last year met this goal. One notable area of concern, however is the 12th grade cohort in Language Arts. One explanation for this lack of growth could be attributed to the fact that most 12th graders are enrolled in a Language Arts classes in the 2nd semester of the school year, which will contribute to greater growth between winter and spring.
