FOOD EXPRESS BUS FEEDING CHILDREN DURING HOLIDAY BREAK

Hundreds of children in Fresno County got a special delivery over the winter holiday break. Fresno EOC Food Services delivered lunches to a number of local communities (Biola, Firebaugh, Mendota, San Joaquin, Del Rey, and Fresno) via two colorful Food Express Buses with the support of Transit Systems drivers. They were able to provide more than 1,350 meals throughout urban and rural Fresno County to ensure children had plenty to eat during the holidays. According to the latest data from Feeding America, more than 61,000 children in Fresno County were food insecure in 2019. Many families struggle to fill the interruption of meals the children depend on while at school. Fresno EOC Food Services and Transit Systems programs not only provide meals to kids throughout the winter months to combat childhood hunger, but the summer months, as well. Be on the lookout for the Food Express Bus delivering meals during the summer.

Both Food Express buses are also designated Safe Place sites. Safe Place is a national outreach and prevention program for youth in crisis. It provides youth, ages 12 to 18, access to immediate help and safety through a network of sites that open their doors to at-risk youth. In partnership with National Safe Place Network, Fresno EOC Sanctuary and Support Services has operated a local Safe Place program for nearly 25 years.

In Fresno, Safe Place consists of a network of 25 partners, 162 physical site locations, and more than 100 mobile sites, including the Fresno Area Express, City of Clovis Transit, and the Food Express Buses, all of which display the black and yellow Safe Place signs. Message From Fresno EOC Transit Systems Director, Thomas Dulin



Summer will be upon us before we know it, and here at Fresno EOC Transit Systems, we are preparing our vehicles for the months ahead. As we know, here in the Fresno area, temperatures can reach well above 95 degrees. Transit Systems wants to make sure everyone is safe on the road.

Therefore, we perform several safety checks to provide a dependable trip for our clients. As a friendly reminder, you may want to check them to ensure your vehicle is ready for the road, too!

Here are a few ways we keep our vehicles in tip-top shape. Besides topping off all fluids, we check the air conditioning system as it is not uncommon for some Freon to leak out during the winter, which can cause your compressor to overwork itself. In addition, our mechanics check the coolant to ensure it is fresh and up to the proper level. Another critical area we check are the tires. Hot roads are hard on rubber. So, we ensure our tires have the correct amount of tread and proper air pressure. The last things we inspect are the belts and hoses under the hood. We check for cracks or minor cuts because, just like tires, the heat is hard on them, as well. And don't forget the air filter so your vehicle can breathe better.
