A. Food Distribution

Patrick Turner, Training & Employment Services Director, provided a comprehensive overview of the Food Distribution program, highlighting efforts to address food insecurity across Fresno County by delivering free food to residents in rural and inner-city communities who are facing economic hardship. The Food Distribution program served 104,225 individuals (22,613 households) through 140 community distributions at 11 sites, supported by 2,775 volunteers. Collectively, these efforts resulted in the distribution of over 1.25 million pounds of food, demonstrating the program's significant impact on community well-being.

Background

This is an evaluation report of the Health Services program that highlights output, impact, and opportunities. The evaluation is intended to provide updates on items addressed in the organization’s community needs assessment, strategic plan, and community action plan.

Fresno EOC’s Health Services program provides education, counseling, and treatment to adults and teens of reproductive age, focusing on prevention of unintended pregnancy, communicable diseases, and overall wellness. The program also offers clinical referrals, outreach, and case management to support healthy behaviors and connect individuals to essential health resources in the community.

Health Services program evaluation includes:

- Programming obligations and objectives
- Analysis of participation and demographic data
- Assessment of services provided and why they are important
- Service impact
- Identification of program opportunities and successes

This evaluation supports compliance with Organizational Standards 4.4, 6.5, and 9.3 related to performance management and program planning and evaluation. Staff will incorporate feedback as needed and will use the findings from this evaluation to guide program enhancement and future grant alignment.

Fresno EOC Health Services provide accessible medical and oral health care through clinics, schools, and community outreach, including education, testing, treatment, transportation, and preventive dental services. Programs are designed to reduce barriers and support the health and well-being of children, youth, and adults.

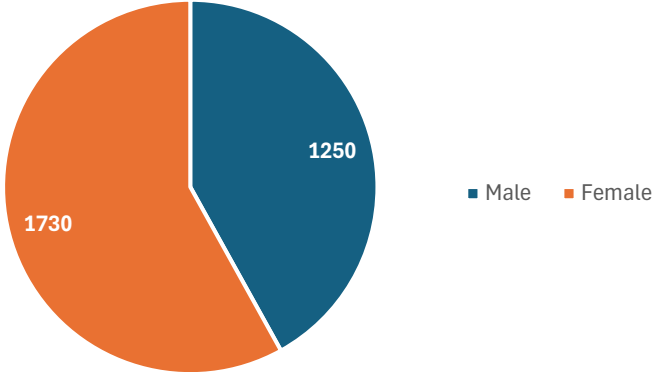

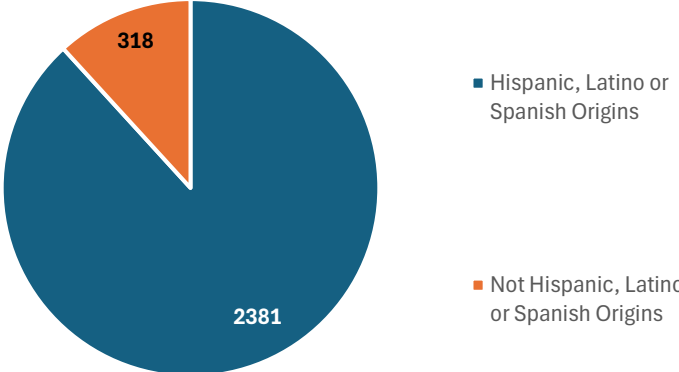

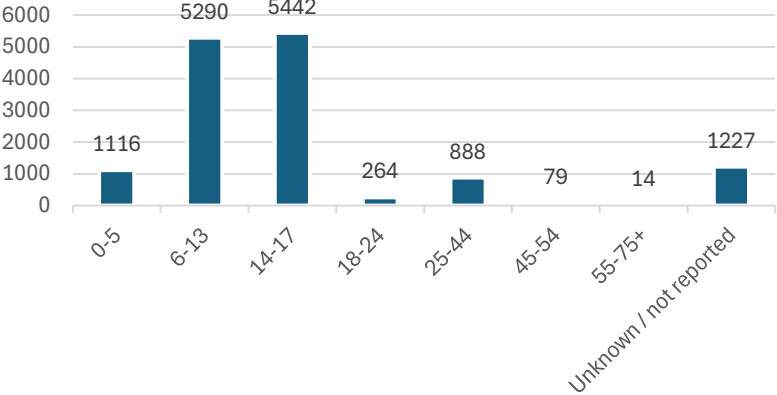
Gender



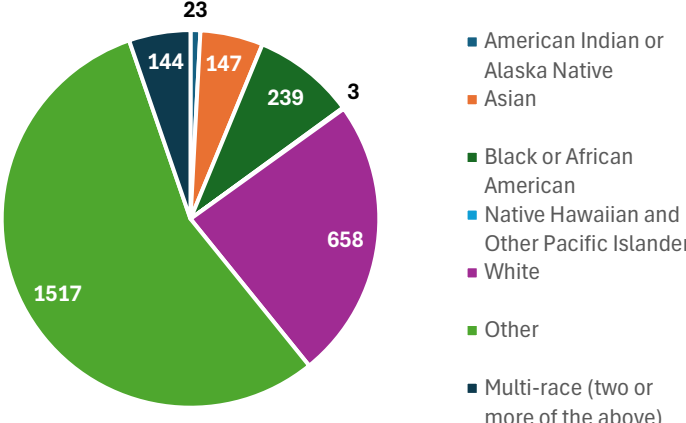

Why Health Services?

- “Social determinants of health such as community levels of high unemployment, low education, and low income—have been associated with higher teen birth rates.” – CDC 2022
- “It is known that the changes in knowledge brought about through CSE have a direct positive effect on the responsibility for children and adolescents’ sexual behavior, thus making it one of the most crucial effects of education.” – National Library of Medicine
- The 2016 California Healthy Youth Act reenforces youth rights to access and learn reproductive health care services. This is state mandate that requires youth to receive this information. Our Community Health Center is a safe, secure, confidential, and best choice for many clients seeking reproductive health care services plus we offer teen transportation services.

Board Opportunities for Support

- There are opportunities for Board members to attend Health Services events and see how the program increases access to much needed health services.
- Health Services continues to search for ways to improve the community's access to health-related programs and we invite Board members to provide strategies and/or opportunities that help align and meet the community's needs.

Key Achievements

- Health Services has now implemented all anticipated projects pertaining to CalAIM. CalAIM is a statewide initiative to transform Medi-Cal, focusing on whole-person care, social determinants of health, and improved access for vulnerable populations.
- Fresno EOC Health Services relocated to the 1920 Building by merging two off site offices. This merger streamlines our services, improves efficiency, and saves money.
- In 2025, Fresno EOC Health Services conducted two Clinic Day events in Fowler, CA and Fresno, CA at multiple Fresno Housing Authority apartment complexes. We were able to provide Rapid STI testing and treatment, dental screenings for children, BP screenings, teen pregnancy prevention classes, parent education classes, and enrolled clients into other services such as WIC and Head Start.
